8. Law enforcement are taking advantage of new technology and are using historical and 8. real time tracking to track and take your personal information. As long as it's turned on your mobile device will tell your position every few minutes from a cell tower if you are using it or not. Government officials and law enforcement often without a warrant can take detailed personal information about you by accessing your history. This would be historical tracking.

Real time tracking is when law enforcement and Government officials track you again by using cell towers to measure signal strengths from your mobile device of any kind and making a digital map of past and present locations.

#### **Proposal for Action:**

As of the December of 2009 about 90% Of the U.S. population subscribed to cell phone service with an estimate of 285.6 million people and only eight states out of fifty need a warrant to track you. This causes a problem between tracked victims and law enforcement because it is an invasion of privacy and allows law enforcement to have the victim's personal information. We believe that you need a search warrant or probable cause which can be more efficient especially to people being tracked who have a criminal record or have evidence to support the case that they were a part of the crime to search their mobile device. This is only directed to law enforcement specifically and not towards civilians Ex:a mother's child is missing and both have a phone then the mother can legally track and find their child. This will also ensure your information safe even after the case has been solved because law enforcement and government officials will lose access to your mobile device and all the information the have gathered that did not concern the case.

#### **Results to be Expected:**

We expect for the amount of states who do not need a specific warrant or only part protection to start going down in numbers and there will be more protection around people's personal information that they have a right to have this can help people who are not concerned in the case but were still suspected and will ensure their personal information is safe. This will help you keep your rights as American citizens.

According to a 10. study by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration revealed that 11. only 50% of returning veterans that need this service received the services they need. 12. Of 300,000 veterans sent to Iraq and Afghanistan, 37% of them were diagnosed with a 13. mental disorder. 21% were diagnosed with PTSD and 17% of them were diagnosed with 15. depression. In Texas, the major areas to be affected would be the police force, justice department, civilians, and animal control.

#### Justification:

10 11 Animals, more specifically dogs, help reduce many health risks for their owners. For 12 example, dog owners have a lower risk of cardiovascular disease and heart attacks. 13 Owning a dog has also proven to lower blood pressure and reduce the risk of diffuse large cell lymphoma. Animals help our society, there are reported cases of therapy dogs 14 having positive effects on patients, helping them by lowering their pain level and giving 15 16 them comfort in their hospital stay. If so many animals are being hurt because of us 17 when they do so much to help us, not only are we not giving them the respect they deserve, but if we continue to let this happen we will be lowering the number of animals 18 that can actually help us. The problem is not that people don't report the animal cases, 19 20 it's that the animal cases aren't pursued. In fact, many of the cases are not compiled, this makes it very difficult to get accurate statistics about animal cruelty. 21 22 "Of the people arrested for animals crimes, 65% have also been arrested for battery against another person." 23

#### **Proposal for Action:**

Our proposal for action is to increase the number of animal abuse cases that are reported, prosecuted and investigated in Texas. By making sure who we give these animals to, whether they were adopted from a shelter or sold for a price, by making sure who we give these animals to, these animal abuse cases may be decreased. #### **Justification:**

A recent study of 52,780 active-duty members of the U.S. Air Force found that 3 percent of male participants and 5.2 percent of female participants reported suicidal ideation in the previous year. Of the participants that reported suicidal ideation, 8.7 percent also reported a recent suicide attempt. While these percentages seem low, we must acknowledge that even one veteran life that is taken because of mental health disease is not acceptable. These men and women sacrifice themselves each and every day for our safety and it is only right that we support them when they 16. come home. Mental health is a tough subject for our veterans, especially since so many of them suffer due to the experiences they've had on deployment. One veteran said that "It terrorises [him] at night. If you have a nightmare where your friends are being blown up, you relive these things over and over and over again." This experience, unfortunately, is not the exception but the rule. Without help, more and more veterans will suffer from these feelings of terror and the suicidal rate will climb.

Our first priority is to reduce animal cruelty cases in Texas. In order to do this, we will take several precautions to determine if the person is fit to own a pet. First, we will issue out a questionnaire to gauge whether the owner is likely or unlikely to mistreat pets. If the person qualifies to own a pet, we will send aon APHIS inspector to inspect their home so that we know that it is an appropriate environment for a pet. If they pass the questionnaire and the first inspection, the person is eligible for a Texas Pet License, and will not have to be inspected again to get the same pet. However, if the individual wants a different type of pet, their house will have to be inspected again to make sure the house qualifies for the pet. To authenticate the measures that have been taken there will be a yearly inspection that takes place. If animal cruelty is suspected, then the inspector will report the case and check on the case every week until it is pursued. In this way, we will know everyone who has a pet and what kind. All major Texas animal shelters will have its own inspectors to complete their jobs when needed. Breeders will be able to call an inspector before they sell a pet to an owner. The questionnaire will be easily accessible to shelters, breeders, and customers alike to know if you would be an acceptable pet owner. Only the breeders and shelters will have access to what answers will be considered correct. On the other hand, customers are allowed to know the requirements for the inspection and what is required for each pet.

Dogfighting, cockfighting and other forms of organized animal cruelty continues in many areas of the United States due to public corruption. (according to:

- 1 Compared to the criminal cruelty compared to other states, Texas animal cruelty laws are very narrow in their scope.
- 2 Puppy mill owners are deceptive. They don't want you to know the truth. They'll never invite you to their rural property, where they keep hundreds of dogs in stacked wire cages. Females don't receive adequate food or care, producing litter after litter until they die of neglect or disease. Many dogs spend their entire lives in a single cage, matted with feces and covered with urine burns, their eyes ulcerated from toxic fumes.
- In puppy mills 50 or 60 more parent dogs who'd likely never seen sunlight or spent a day outside this toxic room.
- Every year in America, it's estimated that 2.11 million puppies are sold that originated from puppy mills, while 3 million are killed in shelters because they are too full and there aren't enough adoptive homes.
- Almost all pet store puppies come from puppy mills.
- there are 5000 puppy mills in the U.S
- Animal cruelty is a common trait in rapist and murderers

Approximately 6.5 million companion animals enter U.S. animal shelters nationwide every year. Of those, approximately 3.3 million are dogs and 3.2 million are cats.

- 1.Most people who abuse animals don't do it on purpose. They hurt animals because they don't think about or realize what they are doing like they keep their dog on a short chain all of the time.
- 2. The next biggest group of animal abusers do it on purpose, but don't keep doing it for a long period of time. These people are usually young, The ones who are aren't really thinking might be mad at someone else (like their parents) and kick their pet dog because they can't kick their parents. Or they may think it's fun to watch an animal run away scared, without really thinking about how the animal feels.
  - 3.The last group of people who hurt animals are the worst. These are people who intentionally hurt animals because they enjoy hurting things, or because it makes them feel powerful. Many of these people would hurt other people if they could get away with it. They just choose to hurt animals because animals are more helpless than people.

Medical marijuana refers to various medicines derived from the cannabis plant. Oils are extracted from the plant, and administered to patients through various methods.

These extracts have been clinically proven to be effective when treating numerous conditions, including: Alzheimer's disease, cancer, Parkinson's disease, epilepsy, Crohn's disease, glaucoma, arthritis, Tourette's syndrome, and multiple sclerosis. In addition to these uses, there are more general applications, such as pain and nausea relief. Medical marijuana has the potential to impact a multitude of people.

The use of medical cannabis has the support of scientists and doctors across the globe. Over sixty U.S. and international health organizations support the legalization of medicinal marijuana. A 1991 Harvard study showed that forty-four percent of oncologists have recommended cannabis treatment to their patients. Another fifty percent stated that they would have recommended cannabis treatment — if

it wasn't illegal. In 2013, an international study discovered that out of 446 doctors from 72 different countries and 56 different states and provinces in North America, seventy-six percent of physicians supported legalization.

One common argument is that marijuana can be addictive, and therefore unsafe. However, addiction with marijuana is largely associated with recreational use, not medical use. This is because medical marijuana is comprised of extracts. These extracts can be modified to accommodate the needs of the patient, which means that the addictive parts of the plant can be excluded. Opponents have several other arguments against legalization. Some claim that medical marijuana is under-researched, but for the past twenty years, hundreds of clinical studies have been conducted. Others add that cannabis can have adverse effects. While this is true, the side effects are relatively minor. These include drowsiness and dizziness. Even with side effects, the promise of relief from their illnesses overshadows the negatives.

Medical marijuana is a versatile drug that has the undeniable potential to improve the lives of millions that struggle with their conditions.

It arrests 1.5m of its citizens each year for drug offences, locking up half a million of them; tougher drug laws are the main reason why one in five black American men spend some time behind bars. Many other states are realizing that this isn't working too. Marijuana reform has gained unprecedented momentum throughout the Americas. Alaska, California, Colorado, Nevada, Oregon, Maine, Massachusetts, Washington State, and Washington D.C. have legalized marijuana for adults.
