Youth & Government is a national YMCA program for high school and middle school students that prepares them for

moral and political leadership through training in the theory and practice of developing public policy.

MISSION

The mission of the YMCA Texas Youth & Government program is to help teenagers become responsible citizens and future leaders of our nation.

GOAL

To create an environment in which students can increase their political awareness and understanding, while learning the meaning of social action through an actual experience in government.

OVERVIEW

This youth-led, civic engagement program allows students to receive exciting hands-on experience in the mechanics of government, along with print and broadcast media. Students participate in their clubs, followed bycompetition at their local District Conference, and finally culminating in a 3-day State Conference at the Capitol in Austin, Texas. Students compete to be selected for the Conference on National Affairs and the National Judicial Competition.

- Help select students to fill allocations at State Conference
- Enforce all YMCA policies at Conferences, including curfews and dress code

AREAS OF PARTICIPATION



Bills are debated, considered in committee and moved to house or senate for consideration



JUDICIAL TRIAL OR APPELLATE

Gives students the knowledge of legal procedure, ability to communicate, questioning skills, reasoning ability and more to debate high press cases



STATE AFFAIRS FORUM

Gives students the opportunity to develop healthy debate with peer across all subsections of politics on the state and national level



MEDIA

Allows students to fully understand and practice the relationship of media with the government

Legislative

- Discuss topics of student interest
- Research a selected policy area
- Write a bill
- Learn and follow Parliamentary Procedure
- Learn and utilize debate skills
- Utilize and increase public speaking skills

Judicial

- Study a realistic criminal or civil case
- Learn trial/appellate court procedures
- Provide Burden of Proof for both prosecution and defense
- Write opening/closing statements and witness examination questions
- Write briefs as well as arguments for court

State Affairs Forum

- Create solution for topics of concern
- Research selected topic
- Write proposal for solution
- Prepare visual aids to illustrate the issue
- Learn and utilize debate skills
- Utilize and increase public speaking skills

Media

- Learn about journalism through completion of assignments
- Select area to participate: broadcast, print, social media, photojournalism
- Report on conferences, create broadcast videos, etc.

Leadership Roles/Officers

- Elected Officers: Youth Governor, Lt. Governor, Secretary of State, Attorney General, Chief Justice, Print Editor, Broadcast Producer, President Pro-Tem of Senate and Speaker of the House
- Lobbyist Roles and Governors Cabinet (work with Youth Governor)
