Travel to and from conference locations during is included for registered participants without any additional charge.

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

\$390 per student (quad occupancy)
\$583 per adult (double occupancy)

Program fee includes hotel (quad occupancy for students; double occupancy for adults), evening activities, meals and conference materials. Please note that there is an additional fee for transportation provided through students local YMCA. Adults can pay an additional \$394 for a private hotel room for the three nights. Options and costs for other student sleeping room occupancy may be available as needed, upon request.

Security and Risk Management Policies

Our Conference hotel as well as all of our conference locations actively use cameras to monitor their facilities. Students and advisors will be on camera and subject to other facility security protocols, such as going through metal detectors upon arrival at the Capitol and Courthouses.

- YMCA TXYG follows child safety and protection policies, as well as risk management policies in accordance with YMCA standards. These polices are in compliance with our YMCA child abuse prevention and safety procedures.
- The Hotel will have zones that will be restricted during various hours of the conference schedule to ensure the safety of students and participants. Students must not be in unsupervised areas of the hotel or conference areas.

TEAM PLANNING

Legislative - 1 student

Media - 1 student (by application)

Mock Trial Teams - 5-8 students per team

State Affairs - 1-3 students per team

Appellate Teams - 2 students per team

***Note judicial teams cannot be guaranteed that their teams won't complete against each other

We will also have student Chairpersons, Clerks, and Judges - student leaders serving as these various roles will preside over the court rooms and committee rooms. These positions will be selected from the pool of chair clerk teams that competed at their regional conference.

We also have a student Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, State Affairs Forum Chair, Attorney General, Chief Justice and Media Co-Editor and Chief. These positions are elected by other student participants during the conference and will have additional responsibilities in their sections the following year.

These student representatives will not participate in the same function as other students but will still be considered part of their state delegations. They will receive pre-conference training for their role. Application information will be sent to regional leadership via email.

WHAT TO BRING

Here are a few reminders of important items to bring to State Conference:

- Copy of your health insurance card (front and back)
- A photo identification or student identification card (Required for some of the government buildings)
- Your prescription medications
- Comfortable dress shoes for walking, we do not recommend that you wear high-heels or shoes that have not been broken-in.
- Copies of the case, statements, and any research you may need. A printer is not available at the conference, so bring whatever printed materials you need.
- Notepad, pen, paper
- Snacks, will help keep meal costs down
- Full coverage swimsuit, extra towel

MEAL PLANNING

State registration fees cover dinner on Thursday, lunch on Friday, and both lunch and dinner on Saturday at the competition venue or hotel.

Any meals not listed above will be considered your own meals. Delegation leaders need to make dinner plans that will allow for efficient eating. Participants can order food for delivery to the hotel, but students and advisors can only eat in their own hotel rooms if they order from off site, and must have food delivered before curfew. The onsite options vary in food type and price tiers.

STUDENT AND ADULT CODE OF CONDUCT

All attendees should be aware that absolutely no alcohol, tobacco products, drugs of any kind or weapons of any kind will be tolerated at conference. Adults: Please be mindful that all adults in attendance are prohibited from consuming alcohol during the conference, as well as socializing with non-participants who are consuming alcohol.

PARENT AND FAMILY POLICY

To accommodate for delegate safety and space limitations during Conference, parents will only be allowed to attend daytime activities and must honor the hotel policy of no visitors after 5pm. Parents are only allowed to attend the Closing Ceremony at the hotel.

There will also be a parent block of hotel rooms that will be offered at a reduced rate so parents can stay at the conference hotel. Please note this does not mean students can stay in hotel rooms with their parents.



DELEGATION FREE TIME

The competition schedule includes some free time to explore the Kalahari Resort. Here are some ideas to consider:

TOMFOOLERY ADVENTURE PARK This portion of the resort includes rides and arcade style games for all ages. This activity includes obstacle courses, mini golf, a cave of mirrors, laser tag and other amusement park style rides. Please note that Tomfoolery access comes with an additional charge of \$26.

INDOOR WATERPARK Unwind after the competition portion of the conference by swimming at the waterparks. With slides, a lazy river, bodyboarding and more there is something for everyone to enjoy in the waterpark. Access is included in your State conference fee, and delegates will have designated pool time!

***PLEASE NOTE:** Access to the water park is determined by swim ability questions answered by parental guardians during program registration.

DRESS CODE

The YMCA Texas Youth and Government State Conference has a Dress Code that all participants must follow. This includes all adults and volunteers. The attire required depends on the session/event/function. Participants not in appropriate attire will be asked to change clothes.

Clothing that is never acceptable includes:

- Any clothing with inappropriate language or imagery
- Any see-through or extremely tight-fitting clothing
- Bare midriffs or tank tops
- Tube tops or tube dresses
- Leggings or sweat pants
- Pajamas, slippers, or any other sleeping attire
- Flip Flops (Only acceptable during free time/pool time)
